3. Time Limits

All matches will run to a 35 minute game clock and 5 minute warm up.

4. Entry Fee & Finance- per team

6. Default Games

Please let us know one week in advance if teams will not be able to participate in a league date. We will adjust the draw where possible.

7. Official Team

All Players must be on their team lists, submitted to Volleyball Manawatu prior to league start date.

8. Warm Up

Teams may take 5 minutes to warm up prior to match start.

9. Match Protocol, Results & Score Sheets

Matches will run to adapted rules as per Volleyball Manawatu Intermediates Rulebook. As linked here: Intermediate Rules Handbook

10. Score sheets must be signed by team coaches at the end of the match.

Results will be posted weekly.

11. Uniform

Team players shall wear their school colour uniforms.

Athletic shoes must be worn by all participants. No hard sole shoes, slides, crocs or bare feet.

12. Libero

No libero is used in intermediate competitions.

13. Net Height

Approx 2.10 meters

14. Match ball

Official match ball to be used is the Molten V5M1500 training Ball. One ball per team can be signed out at the desk. It is your team's responsibility to return the ball post game.

15. substitutions

Teams may rotate players on/off with two players exclusively swapping for one another.

OR

Teams may rotate off at the right front position and have a substitution line enter as the server.

16. Official protest

If there is a dispute that needs resolution beyond that capacity of event staff please email admin@volleyballmanawatu.co.nz, so that this can be action by the proper governing authority.

17. Duty

All referees will be supplied by Volleyball Manawatu. Please be kind and respectful of our refs, these are high school students who are building their own reffing skills. Referees will keep score and submit results to League Organizers

18. Coach and player behaviour

MRVA is committed to the prevention of child abuse and to the protection of children and young people. The well-being and safety of children and young people is important to our organisation.

Players, Coaches, and Managers are expected to demonstrate good sportsmanship and to behave appropriately at all times. Inappropriate behaviour that in the opinion of the organisers brings the game into disrepute will be subject to sanction penalties.

Volleyball Manawatu does not tolerate improper behaviour including but not limited to bullying, racism and sexual harassment of any form from participants to spectators.

During matches League Management have the authority to issue penalties to players or coaching staff in accordance with the sanction scale in the rules of the game.

19. Spectators

As Spectators, you are expected to:

- Demonstrate appropriate social behaviour;
- Not let your behaviour detract from the participants' enjoyment;
- Let game officials conduct events without interference;
- Support skilled performances and team play with generous applause; and
- Demonstrate respect for opposing players and their supporters.
